
# **Welcome** to the June edition of "The Nugget," the newsletter for Narcotics Anonymous in the Gold Coast area.

#### **Home Groups**

Home groups are the core of Narcotics
Anonymous, providing essential support for recovering addicts. In these groups, members meet regularly to share experiences and build connections, promoting healing and personal growth.

Service at the home group level is crucial for the group's functioning. Members take roles like chairing meetings, welcoming newcomers, and managing finances or providing tea and coffee services.

Service can be as simple as putting out the chairs or washing the dishes. These roles not only help the group but also support individual recovery by fostering accountability and commitment to staving clean

### **Service Story**

Hi, my name is Reem and I'm an addict.

I have been in the rooms of Narcotics Anonymous for 12 years and one of the earliest memories I have is of a woman with 2 years clean running around worried that she had printed the IP documents on the wrong-coloured paper.

I remember thinking to myself, gosh no, I am not joining a cult and becoming obsessed with trivial things like that.

I had heard that service kept you clean but had no idea that the effort I put into the little things in the fellowship, multiplied in life.

I didn't take notice of any of the suggestions, and it took me almost 8 years to come back into the rooms after a relapse. I was determined to follow that simple cliche along with the simple suggestions of the program.

I started off doing group service, in my homegroup, as the milk and biscuit girl in the women's meeting.

Within 6 months I had the key to that room and was Secretary and was worried about trivial details like which order to display the banners and if we should share for 5 or 7 mins

Doing area service has given me a sense of purpose and a taste of what responsibility looks like and what it feels like to keep a commitment.

I slowly worked my way into an area subcommittee for H&I, organizing speakers every fortnight for almost 18 months.



#### Reem continued.

Service for the area subcommittee meant I was always announcing the need for members to share their story, which meant members I wouldn't usually speak to approached me and we exchanged phone numbers and stories. My contact list is full of NA members who I can contact when times are tough.

When I go to meetings outside my area, or when I'm at bigger events like unity days and conventions; there is always someone around who I have spoken to and it always feels like I have a friend to chat with. NA, Narcotics Anonymous and to me also means Never Alone.

Recently I took on an area position as the literature chair, ordering literature for the groups as needed.

My recent position has given me access to the area banking, which has helped grow my trust in my Higher Power, there was a time in my life that having access to that much money would results in disaster but having the god of my own understanding helps, having the trust of my fellowship and the guidance of my sponsor I am able to fulfil my requirements without worrying that old behavioural patterns will resurface- just for today.

They say service keeps you clean, and this is true, but it also keeps me connected, honest and out of my own head and for that I am grateful.

I am grateful for the fellowship and am grateful for those before me who did service. I can't, we can.

People Who Need People Are the Luckiest People in the World / Use Under Adult Supervision, 2020 (Wood, Childrens Floaties) was the first artwork I created after a 5-year relapse.



I was stuck in a vicious cycle of maintenance ending with a suicide attempt after a heavy meth bender in psychosis.
That cycle began with codeine abuse while I was studying art a year prior to going on maintenance.



It was exhibited in Sculpture in the Gaol in 2021 (Oh the irony)

The work explored the unassailable impact of negative core beliefs - real or perceived - on self-actualization; and the importance of family, friends, and fellowship in carrying me when I am unable to generate my own momentum.

Addiction is the disease of isolation so the greatest service a recovering addict can ever give is their time in friendship. People who need people are the luckiest people in the world.

World NA PR Week is the 5th to the 10th of June and the theme is 'We all are PR'.

So what does that mean?

That the most powerful way our primary purpose happens, (to carry our message to the addict that still suffers – Tradition 5), is addicts staying clean and working the program. We are shining examples of our promise, (That an addict, any addict, can stop using, lose the desire to use and find a new way to live – Basic Text page 65).


PR is about building relationships. Our family and extended family, people we know and used with, see how the NA program has turned our life around. This is attraction rather than promotion – 11th Tradition.

When we as members interact with venue providers and treatment facilities, we are PR representatives.

NA cannot help addicts if they never hear of us. The goal of PR is that every using addict hears our message of hope. A great way your group can support PR Week is to put some NA posters or business cards in places where using addicts will see them, such as police stations, dosing chemists, probation and parole offices, needle exchanges. food banks etc. Or join the PR sub-committee and get involved.

It's easy-tounderstand language makes it accessible to anyone, regardless of where they are in their recovery journey.



### 3 ingredient Peanut Butter cookies.

You will need.

#### Ingredients

- 1 medium egg, room temperature, beaten
- Half a cup of sugar.
- Half a cup creamy peanut butter.
- 1. In a large bowl, mix all ingredients.
- 2. Scoop by level tablespoonfuls and roll into balls.
- 3. Place on ungreased baking paper and flatten with a fork.
- 4. Bake at 180° until set, about 18 minutes. Remove to wire racks to cool.
