#### **Service Prayer:**

#### 12 Traditions of Narcotics Anonymous:

- 1. Our common welfare should come first; personal recovery depends on NA unity.
- 2. For our group purpose there is but one ultimate authority— a loving God as He may express Himself in our group conscience. Our leaders are but trusted servants; they do not govern.
- 3. The only requirement for membership is a desire to stop using.
- 4. Each group should be autonomous except in matters affecting other groups or NA as a whole.
- 5. Each group has but one primary purpose—to carry the message to the addict who still suffers.
- 6. An NA group ought never endorse, finance, or lend the NA name to any related facility or outside enterprise, lest problems of money, property, or prestige divert us from our primary purpose.
- 7. Every NA group ought to be fully self-supporting, declining outside contributions.
- 8. Narcotics Anonymous should remain forever nonprofessional, but our service centres may employ special workers.
- 9. NA, as such ought never be organized, but we may create service boards or committees directly responsible to those they serve.
- 10. Narcotics Anonymous has no opinion on outside issues; hence the NA name ought never be drawn into public controversy.
- 11. Our public relations policy is based on attraction rather than promotion; we need always maintain personal anonymity at the level of press, radio, and films.
- 12. Anonymity is the spiritual foundation of all our Traditions, ever reminding us to place principles before personalities.

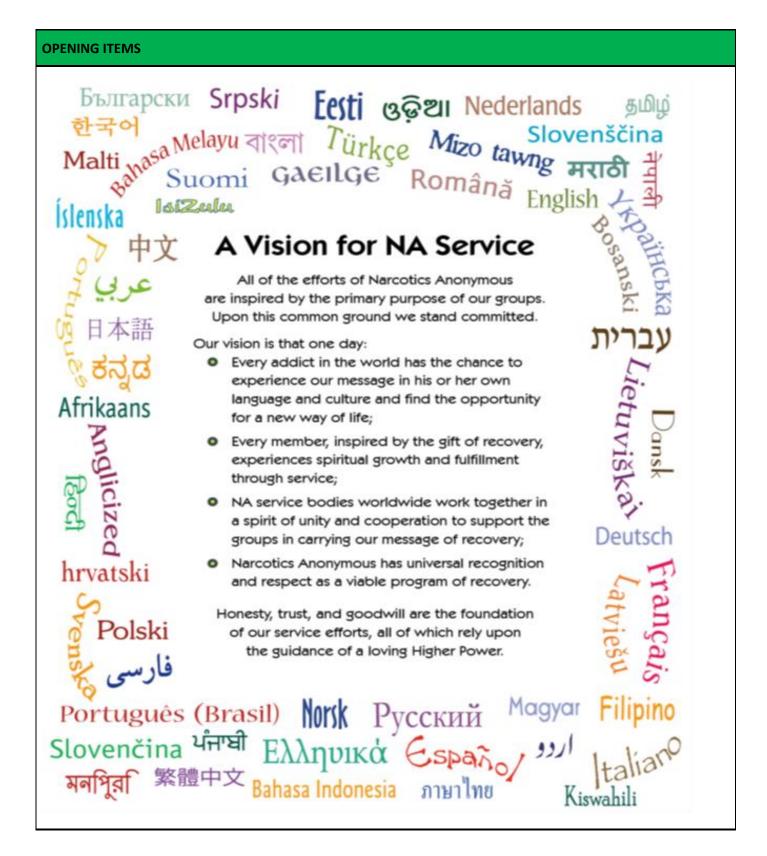


#### **OPENING ITEMS**

#### **Twelve Concepts for NA Service:**

- 1. To fulfil our fellowship's primary purpose, the NA groups have joined together to create a structure which develops, coordinates, and maintains services on behalf of NA as a whole.
- 2. The final responsibility and authority for NA services rests with the NA groups.
- 3. The NA groups delegate to the service structure the authority necessary to fulfil the responsibilities assigned to it.
- 4. Effective leadership is highly valued in Narcotics Anonymous. Leadership qualities should be carefully considered when selecting trusted servants.
- 5. For each responsibility assigned to the service structure, a single point of decision and accountability should be clearly defined.
- 6. Group conscience is the spiritual means by which we invite a loving God to influence our decisions.
- 7. All members of a service body bear substantial responsibility for that body's decisions and should be allowed to fully participate in its decision-making processes.
- 8. Our service structure depends on the integrity and effectiveness of our communications.
- 9. All elements of our service structure have the responsibility to carefully consider all viewpoints in their decision-making processes.
- 10. Any member of a service body can petition that body for the redress of a personal grievance, without fear of reprisal.
- 11. NA funds are to be used to further our primary purpose and must be managed responsibly.
- 12. In keeping with the spiritual nature of Narcotics Anonymous, our structure should always be one of service, never of government.

	Q: RCM Gold Coast asks about the fund flow process.	
	A: The Vice Chair confirms the fixed amounts and frequency of fund flows to APF and NAWS. The Chair then explains the process of distributing excess funds above the ARSC's prudent reserve and expenses – 1/3 to APF and 2/3's to NAWS	
	Q: Vice Chair asks the Treasurer how he is going?	
	A: The Treasurer replies that he is going well and continues to be grateful for the support. The Vice Chair then speaks to the benefits of having an Assistant Treasurer.

	Prior to formal discussion, Vice Chair raises the <b>Travel Policy</b> to clarify how to complete the <b>Travel Reimbursement Form.</b>	
2.1	<ul> <li>Main Travel – main travel is the means by which ARSC members travel from their home city to the ARSC city – e.g. flights, long distance train, car. Regional Committee Members (RCMs) will have their main travel costs paid for by the ARSC (air travel, petrol costs, bus/train). All other expenses such as hotels/accommodation, per diems, airport transfers will be paid for by their respective Areas.</li> <li>Accommodation is reimbursed up to \$110/per night – must provide accommodation receipts.</li> <li>Per diems: maximum per diem allowance is \$100/day. It is not necessary to provide receipts for meals, but you must submit a reimbursement request to receive the per diem allowance which will ask for your daily total meal expense. The per diem is granted on actual expenditure, rather than automatically awarding the maximum allowance. Receipts should be included for other items being claimed – e.g. local taxis, trains, etc.</li> <li>Q: RCM Victoria – Is it ok to record food only as expenses?</li> </ul>	Start 10.36 Finish 11.00



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	A: Vice Chair – Yes – however if additional travel (ie trains/taxi) is being claimed as part of the per diem allowance (max \$100/day) it should also be recorded and receipts provided	
	Q: Gold Coast RCM – Is this process for accountability to the ARSC or our ASC?	
	A: Vice Chair – RCM's are accountable to their ASC's if being funded to attend the ARSC – each ASC should have it's own process for accountability.	
	Q: RCM Far North Coast (FNC) – Can I book my own flights?	
	A: Vice Chair – this is not the preferred method – it is preferred that we use the travel agent as they understand our requirements.	
	Q: FNC – what if I can find cheaper flights?	
	A: Policy Chair – Flight Centre has a credit – I believe it has now been used? Vice Chair confirms yes – credit has been used.	
	A: Vice Chair [explains travel process for their employment] Confirms that Flight Centre agent has a criteria that they follow. This process provides price efficiency and value.	
	Q: FSO Chair: Is parking an expense that is covered?	
	A: Local participants aren't normally eligible for travel reimbursements if travel to the ARSC is less than 75km. If travel is >75km, the travel policy applies.	
	Q: FSO Chair - Is fuel reimbursed at a kilometre rate?	
	A: Policy Chair – no – we accept fuel receipts. Vice Chair then explains that the best way to do this is leave on a full tank, fill up upon arrival, then submit the receipt and double to cover there and back. RD states that the travel policy needs some work.	
	Vice chair – States that the travel policy can be reviewed at another time. Please ensure that all likely expenses are reported to the Treasurer asap so that they have an idea of expenses for the closing balance.

4.1	In relation to discussion Item 1: QR Codes, the Chair then updated the ARSC explaining that he had been in touch with IT and that a QR code was being developed. The Chair will update as the process progresses.	
	Discussion Item 2	
	Position speaking to item: Newcastle Hunter Valley	
	Discussion item: Phoneline Volunteers and Anonymity on Social Media	
	Discussion:	
	The RCM for Newcastle and Hunter Valley (NHV) commenced discussion by explaining that their Area was concerned about newcomers names and phone numbers being posted on social media for contacting by NA Members. NHV explained that there were concerns that these newcomers were possibly vulnerable and that posting such sensitive information could leave them open to interaction that may not be appropriate. NHV went on to say that the practice was supported by a well established OCM from Sydney.	



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	A: The RD stated that new members should be referred to the local committee/community but not have their details posted on social media. The RD continued on to say that the ARSC is not affiliated with any social media based groups that NA communities have created (eg Facebook groups/pages).	
	A: The Chair stated that the ARSC pays a lot for Twillio and that using that service would mean it is not necessary to use social media.	
	Q: RCM Sydney East states they are aware of the Sydney member that has been doing this. Would you like us to contact them?

	Intent - That NAOA continue to be supported by the Australian Region and have representation at the ARSC as a seated area.  Detail - NA@Home Area (Blue Jeans platform, previously Paltalk and Skype) was established in 2011 by a group of Australian members seeking to attend meetings online. Since then, we've seen the area grow to 21 meetings per week.	
	The area has always been well supported by the Australian Region and was acknowledged as a seated area in 2020. Since then, our RCMs have represented our area at the ARSC.	
	Unfortunately, a situation evolved where a single individual had a disproportionate influence over the area, controlling the domain name, communications, treasury and online platform. At one stage a single individual concurrently held positions of Area Chair, Treasurer, Tech Admin and Secretary plus multiple group positions.	
	Attempts to encourage rotation of service positions (on an area level) were eventually effective though efforts to observe NA Traditions and Concepts 4, 6, 7, 9 and 12 resulted in escalating bullying and abuse of members of the ASC.	
	These issues have been referenced in previous RCM reports to the ARSC.	
	A member has also reported "There are also so many individuals like myself, simply attending meetings, not in any service position, who were belittled, and whose recovery was called into question to the level that it profoundly affected my life for a while, and I must not be the only one I knowI left because of it and thought I was the only one but I've now found many others who felt the same".	
	On the 25th June 2023 an individual announced that a portion of NA@Home meetings intended to leave the Area and the Australian Region. This announcement was minuted and has been seen by an ARSC trusted servant.
